In over 25 years, it has recognized 0 miraculous cures at Medjugorje. (True)</p>
<p>Medjugorje has resulted in numerous spiritual healing and conversions. (False)</p>	<p>It is the <b>FAITH</b> of the believers that has led to their spiritual healing and conversions. (True)</p>
<p>If the Pope has made a comment in favor of Medjugorje, this must be accepted as being divinely inspired. (False)</p>	<p>With all due respect for the Pope, his personal opinions are not an infallible proclaimed dogma of the Catholic Church. <u>They remain his personal opinion.</u> (True)</p>
<p>Sr. Lucia, Mother Theresa, the Pope, all say that Our Lady is appearing in Medjugorje. (False)</p>	<p>This is propaganda that was written after these blessed persons have passed away. <u>It is all hearsay.</u> (True)</p>
<p>Thousands of Cardinals, Bishops and priests have visited Medjugorje because they believe in it. (False)</p>	<p>Cardinals, Bishops and priests have an obligation <u>to discern the spirits</u> in order to inform the faithful. Unfortunately, because a priest is investigating the matter, this fact is distorted to classify him among the supporters of Medjugorje. This is a common practice among false visionaries who seek to gain credibility. (True)</p>

<p><u>“Those Christians who go to church without preparation, without receiving Holy Communion, without giving thanks, it is better that they do not go because their hearts become hard.”</u> [24th June 1981] (To Jelena, Grey Book Part 1) (False)</p>	<p>“Together with the Synod, I earnestly call upon pastors and the whole community of the faithful to help the divorced, and with solicitous care to make sure that they do not consider themselves as separated from the Church, for as baptized persons they can, and indeed must, share in her life. <u>They should be encouraged to listen to the word of God, to attend the Sacrifice of the Mass</u>, to persevere in prayer, to contribute to works of charity and to community efforts in favor of justice, to bring up their children in the Christian faith, to cultivate the spirit and practice of penance and thus implore, day by day, God's grace.
